

How to crochet an official Corpse Full of Bees bee

1 Materials

- Yellow dk yarn
- Black dk yarn
- White dk yarn
- 3.5mm crochet hook

2 Body

In order to confuse you, I'm British but I'm using US crochet terminology.

- Make a slipknot in your yellow yarn. Chain 6 and join in a circle with a slip stitch.
- \$ Single crochet once into back loop of chain stitch, single crochet twice into back loop of next chain stitch.
- Repeat from \$ until round is complete. End round with slip stitch.(9sts)
- Join black yarn. Single crochet into each st. End round with slip stitch.
- Work as 3, but with yellow yarn. Round 5: Work as 3, but with black yarn. Round 6: Work as 3, but with yellow yarn.
- Join adjacent sts together with single crochet. Bind off, push yarn ends inside bee body to form squashy ersatz stuffing.

3 Wings

- Join white yarn on side of body in central yellow stripe.
- (sc, dc, dc, tr, dc, dc, sc) in next yellow stitch. Slip stitch into next yellow st.
- (sc, dc, dc, tr, dc, dc, sc) in next yellow stitch. Slip stitch into next yellow st. Bind off, push yarn ends inside bee body.

Hurrah! Now rock out.
